**Dr Noritta Morseau-Diop** is a First Nations woman originally from Tamwoy Town, Thursday Island, in Far North Queensland. She became **the first Torres Strait Islander to graduate with a PhD** from the University of Queensland

As a highly experienced academic, social worker and counselling practitioner, Dr Noritta has been **working in and alongside Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities** and within non-Indigenous communities throughout the state of Queensland for well **over thirty years**.

Her areas of work include grief and loss counselling, **support and rehabilitation for incarcerated persons**, cross-cultural education, and **advocacy for Indigenous health, human rights, and social justice**.

Morseau-Diop has specialised in understanding the experiences of incarcerated Indigenous people and published her research in a book: **Healing in Justice: Giving a Voice to the Silent and Forgotten People**. In 2018 she received the **Indigenous Community Impact Award**. She has also received the Winston Churchill Fellowship.
